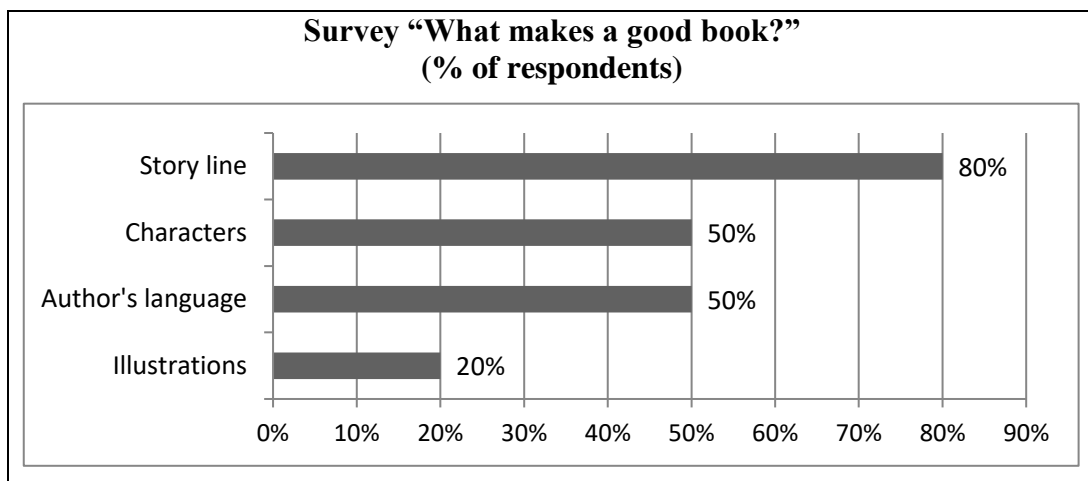

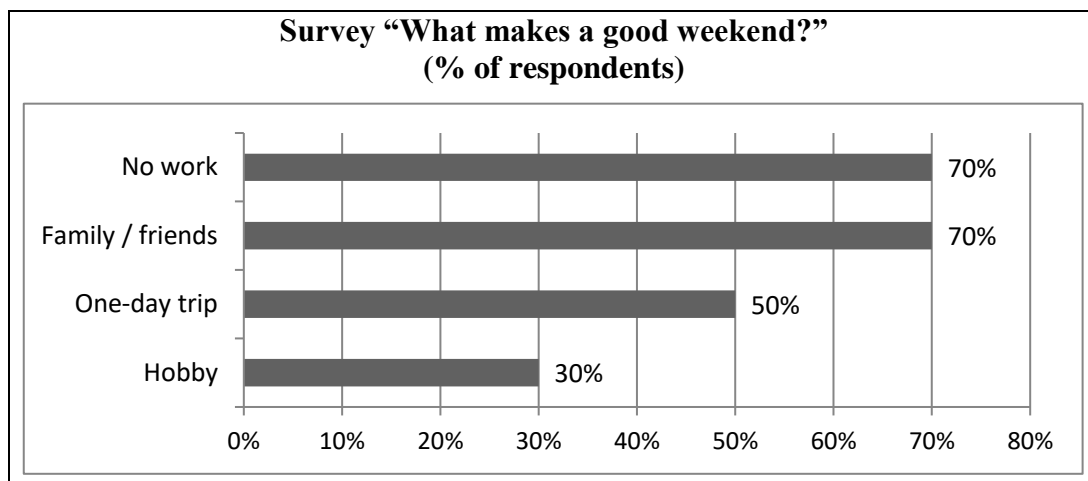
Time: 3–4 minutes
