Europe is home to some of the most beautiful villages in the world.

A. Bibury, England

The nineteenth-century artist and craftsman William Moris called Bibury the most beautiful village in England. Bibury is most famous for its stone-built cottages, called "Arlington Row". On a trip to the Cotswolds, Henry Ford tried to buy the entire row of houses to ship back to Michigan so that he could include them in Greenfield Village. "Arlington Row" has become a film and television location for blockbuster films including Stardust and Bridget Jones's Diary.

B. Bled, Slovenia

One of Slovenia's top tourist attractions, Bled is famous for its ancient castles and picturesque views. Seekers of beauty and the challenges of sport will find here a multitude of opportunities. Walking around the lake, traditional boats, the nearby ski trails, the castle treasures, hunting, fishing,—all these are but fragments of Bled's attraction.

C. Colmar, France

Colmar is renowned for its well preserved old town and its museums. Fondly called "Little Venice", because of canals in the area, this small village looks like it came out of a Disney movie. Colmar's view served for the design of the Japanese animated film *Howl's Moving Castle*.

D. Folegandros, Greece

Santorini's streets are crowded with admirers, but in the villages on Folegandros, you'll find similar architecture – streets paved in slate, whitewashed buildings decorated with colourful flowers, the occasional Greek Orthodox church with a bright blue dome – without the crowds.

E. Gruyères, Switzerland

Gruyères is an important tourist location in the upper valley of the Saane river. Built in medieval times, the small but beautifully kept tiny village provides fabulous views of the surrounding countryside. The entire town is car-free, and the cobbled main street is an uphill slope to the castle, so remember to wear comfortable shoes.

F. Montrésor, France

Montrésor is famous for preserving the cultural traditions and historical architecture. The village retains its 11th century fortress, with walls, towers and gate intact. Built originally for defensive purposes, the castle at Montrésor was later transformed into a Renaissance Mansion, within the original fortified walls.

G. Pučišća, Croatia

This magnificent village was built almost entirely of local stone. The village has preserved the historical art of stonework, with parents passing the knowledge down to their children. Nowadays a stonemason school is working there. Just walk and admire the houses and the fortress.

might think so, but in fact, these restaurants offer food for Western tastes. A dish in one

BALLOON-POWERED INTERNET FOR EVERYONE

Many of us think of the Internet as a global community. But two-thirds of the world's population does not yet have Internet access. Project Loon is designed to connect rural and remote areas and bring people back online after disasters.

The technology

Project Loon balloons float in the stratosphere, twice as high as airplanes and the weather. In the stratosphere, there are many layers of wind blowing in various directions. Loon balloons go where they're needed by rising or descending into a layer of wind blowing in the desired direction of travel. People can connect to the balloon network directly from their phones and other devices. Balloons send wireless signals back to the global Internet using high-speed links.

How LOON flies

Project Loon balloons travel approximately 20 km above the Earth's surface in the stratosphere. Each layer of wind in the stratosphere varies in speed and direction. Project Loon uses software algorithms to determine where its balloons need to go, then moves each one into a layer of wind blowing in the right direction. By moving with the wind, the balloons can be arranged to form one large communications network. Each balloon can provide connectivity to a ground area about 40 km in diameter using a wireless communications technology.

How LOON is designed

The inflatable* part of the balloon is called a balloon envelope. A well-made balloon envelope is critical for allowing a balloon to last around 100 days in the stratosphere. Loon's balloon envelopes are made from sheets of polyethylene plastic, and they measure fifteen meters wide by twelve meters tall when fully inflated*. When a balloon is ready to be taken out of service, gas is released from the envelope to bring the balloon down to Earth.

When LOON began

Project Loon began in June 2013 with an experimental pilot in New Zealand, where a small group of Project Loon pioneers tested Loon technology. The results of the pilot test, as well as subsequent tests in New Zealand, California's Central Valley and in Northeast Brazil, are being used to improve the technology in preparation for the next stages of the project.

Where LOON is going

Thirty balloons were launched from New Zealand's South Island and beamed Internet to a small group of pilot testers. The pilot test has since expanded to include a greater number of people over a wider area. Looking ahead, Project Loon will continue to expand the pilot, with the goal of establishing a ring of uninterrupted connectivity at latitudes** in the Southern Hemisphere, so that pilot testers in these latitudes can receive continuous service via balloon-powered Internet.
