If you are catfishing, there is much cause for concern.

Catfishing is the practice of pretending to be someone you are not online and starting emotional relationships with others as this alternate persona.

In reality, catfishing is not as uncommon as one might think. The anonymity of the internet offers individuals the opportunity to present in ways that face to face familiar contact could never allow. Teens are in the midst of searching for their identity. That is why they are prime candidates to start in the catfish game. Teens may believe that online catfishing is simply harmless fun. The problem however, is that sometimes what may start off as a joke can be very dangerous.

Catfishers use fake profiles to find interested partners. The people teens may be corresponding with may be far from harmless. These days hunting down a catfisher can be easier than teens may realize. With a little online investigation, someone may be less than pleased to learn the teen's real identity.

If you have been catfishing, the following steps are recommended: Take down the fake profile, change your phone number and email address, stop yourself from throwing out a line and don't be afraid to talk to your parents.

Catfishing is far from an innocent game. It can cause emotional confusion for the victim. It can also be dangerous business because you may underestimate the intentions of the individual on the other end of the hook. Don't search for online adventures. Avoid such situations.

Words and their stories

Now, the Voice of America special English program, Words and their stories. Today, we'll talk all about expressions with the word 'green'.

Green is the color of most growing plants. We can also say that a person on the boat looks green if he is feeling sick from high waves. Sometimes, it describes something that is not yet ripe or finished.

For example, 'a greenhorn' is someone who has no experience. In the fifteenth century, a greenhorn was a young cow or ox whose horns had not yet developed. A century later, a greenhorn was a soldier who had not yet had any experience in battle. By the eighteenth century, a greenhorn had the meaning it has today – a person who is new in a job.

Someone who can grow plants well is said to have a 'green thumb'. The expression comes from the early 1900. A person with a green thumb seems to have a magic touch that makes plants grow quickly and well. You might say that the woman next door has a green thumb if her garden continues to grow long after your plants have died.

The 'Green Revolution' is the name given some years ago to the development of new kinds of rice and other grains. The new plants produced much larger crops. The Green Revolution was the result of hard work by agricultural scientists.

Green is also the color used to describe the powerful emotion, jealousy. The 'green-eyed monster' is not a frightening creature from outer space. It describes the unpleasant feeling a person has when someone has something he wants.
