

## 2022 METŲ PAGRINDINĖS SESIJOS UŽSIENIO KALBOS (ANGLŲ) VALSTYBINIO BRANDOS EGZAMINO REZULTATŲ

# STATISTINĖ ANALIZĖ


2016 m. įsigaliojo nauja užsienio kalbos (anglų, prancūzų, rusų, vokiečių) egzamino programa, pagal kurią valstybinį brandos egzaminą (VBE) sudaro keturios dalys: klausymo (sakytinio teksto supratimo), skaitymo (rašytinio teksto supratimo), rašymo (rašytinės sąveikos ir raiškos) ir kalbėjimo (sakytinės sąveikos ir raiškos) užduotys. Kiekvienai iš šių dalių skiriama po 25 proc. taškų. Egzaminas vykdomas dviem etapais skirtingomis dienomis.

2022 m. birželio 6 d. įvyko užsienio kalbos (anglų) valstybinio brandos egzamino klausymo, skaitymo ir rašymo dalys, o balandžio 20, 21 ir 22 d. – užsienio kalbos (anglų) brandos egzamino kalbėjimo dalis. Egzaminą leista laikyti 17 622 kandidatams, vidurinio ugdymo programos baigiamųjų klasių mokiniams. Dėl įvairių priežasčių į egzaminą neatvyko 580 kandidatų. Anglų kalbos egzamine dalyvavo ir įvertinimą gavo **17 042** kandidatai. 2022 m. birželio 29 d. ir liepos 1 d. įvyko pakartotinės sesijos užsienio kalbos (anglų) valstybinis brandos egzaminas. Jį leista laikyti 131 kandidatui. Iš jų 108 kandidatai egzaminą laikė ir gavo įvertinimą, o 23 kandidatai į egzaminą neatvyko.

Maksimali taškų suma, kurią galėjo surinkti laikantieji egzaminą, – 100 taškų. Minimali egzamino išlaikymo taškų sumos riba – 16 taškų (arba 16 proc. visų galimų taškų). Anglų kalbos valstybinio brandos egzamino neišlaikė 278 laikiusieji (1,63 proc.), kurie surinko nuo 0 iki 15 užduoties taškų.

Toliau pateikiama statistinė analizė buvo parengta, remiantis 2022 m. pagrindinės sesijos užsienio kalbos (anglų) valstybinį brandos egzaminą laikiusių ir gavusiųjų įvertinimą rezultatais.

Anglų kalbos valstybinio brandos egzamino kandidatų surinktų užduoties taškų vidurkis yra 59,4 taško, taškų sumos standartinis nuokrypis yra 20. Šiomet iš 100 galimų taškų daugiausiai buvo surinkta 100 taškų. Anglų kalbos valstybinį brandos egzaminą laikiusių kandidatų surinktų taškų pasiskirstymas pateiktas 1 diagramoje.




**1 diagrama.** Užsienio kalbos (anglų) valstybinį brandos egzaminą laikiusių kandidatų surinktų taškų histograma

Merginos sudarė 50,2 proc. visų laikiusių šį egzaminą. Jos vidutiniškai surinko 59,0 užduoties taško. Vaikinai vidutiniškai surinko 59,8 užduoties taško. Anglų kalbos egzamino neišlaikė 150 merginos ir 128 vaikinai, tai sudaro atitinkamai 1,8 ir 1,5 proc.

Valstybinio brandos egzamino vertinimas yra kriterinis. Minimalus išlaikyto valstybinio brandos egzamino įvertinimas yra 16 balų, maksimalus – 100 balų. Šie balai į dešimtbalės skalės pažymį nėra verčiami. Jie įrašomi į kandidato brandos atestato priedą kaip valstybinio brandos egzamino įvertinimas. Visi kandidatai pagal gautą įvertinimą priskiriami vienam iš trijų pasiekimų lygių – patenkinamam, pagrindiniam arba aukštesniajam. Aukštesnijį pasiekimų lygi pasiekė 21,3 proc. kandidatų, pagrindinį pasiekimų lygi pasiekė 59,6 proc., o patenkinamajį – 17,5 proc. visų laikiusių.



Lentelėje I d. atitinka klausymo užduotis, II d. – skaitymo užduotis, III d. – rašymo užduotis (pastarosios vertinamos pagal tris kriterijus: 1.1 ir 2.1 – turinys, 1.2 ir 2.2 – teksto struktūra ir forma, 1.3 ir 2.3 – leksinių ir gramatininių formų bei struktūrų ivairovė ir taisyklingumas, rašyba ir skyryba; registras).

3 diagramoje skaičiais nurodytas galimas surinkti maksimalus taškų skaičius, kurį galima surinkti, atsakius į tam tikro sunkumo klausimus. Iš diagramos matyti, kad dauguma klausimų užsienio kalbos (anglų) egzaminą laikiusiems kandidatams buvo lengvi ir vidutinio sunkumo.

Apibendrinus informaciją kandidatų darbuose, kiekvienam užduoties klausimui (ar jo daliai, jeigu jis sudarytas iš struktūrinių dalių), buvo nustatyti šie parametrai:


- **Kandidatų, pasirinkusių atitinkamą atsakymą** (jei klausimas buvo su pasirenkamaisiais atsakymais) ar **surinkusių atitinkamą skaičių taškų** (0, 1, 2 ir t. t.), **dalis**. Lentelėse prie atsakymų pasirinkimų ar surinkto taškų skaičiaus nurodytos kandidatų procentinės dalys yra suapvalintos.
- **Klausimo sunkumas.** Ši parametras išreiskia tokis santykis:

$$\frac{\text{Visų kandidatų už šį klausimą surinktų taškų suma}}{\text{Visų už šį klausimą teoriškai galimų surinkti taškų suma}} \times 100$$

Jeigu klausimas buvo vertinamas vienu tašku, jo sunkumas tiesiogiai parodo, kuri dalis kandidatų į tą klausimą atsakė teisingai.

- **Klausimo skiriamoji geba.** Šis parametras rodo, kaip atskiras egzamino klausimas išskiria stipresnius ir silpnesnius kandidatus. Jeigu klausimas buvo labai lengvas ir į jį beveik vienodai sėkmingai atsakė ir stipresni, ir silpnesni kandidatai, tokio klausimo skiriamoji geba maža. Panaši skiriamoji geba gali būti ir labai sunkaus klausimo, į kurį atsakė labai mažai kandidatų. Neigiamo skiriamosios gebos reikšmė rodo, kad silpnesnieji (sprendžiant pagal visą egzamino užduotį) už tą klausimą surinko daugiau taškų negu stipresnieji. Taigi neigiamo skiriamoji geba – prasto klausimo požymis. Pagal testų teoriją vidutinio sunkumo geri klausimai būna tie, kurių skiriamoji geba yra 40–50, o labai geri – kurių skiriamoji geba 60 ir daugiau. Dėl įvairių pedagoginių ir psichologinių tikslų kai kurie labai sunkūs arba labai lengvi klausimai vis tiek pateikiami teste, nors jų skiriamoji geba ir neoptimali.
- **Klausimo koreliacija su visa užduotimi.** Tai už konkretų klausimą surinktų taškų ir visų už užduotį surinktų taškų koreliacijos koeficientas (apskaičiuojamas naudojant Pirsono koreliacijos koeficientą). Šis parametras rodo, kuria dalimi atskiras klausimas žinias ir gebėjimus matuoja taip, kaip ir visa užduotis. Daugiataškio klausimo koreliacija su visa užduotimi yra didesnė negu vienataškio.

4 diagramoje pavaizduotas anglų kalbos VBE klausymo, skaitymo ir rašymo dalių užduočių išsibarstymas pagal šių užduočių sunkumą ir skiriamąją gebą. Joje taškeliais vaizduojamos užduotys, o raudona parabolės linija – užduotis atitinkanti regresijos kreivę.

### Because Internet: Understanding the New Rules of Language

We use the internet as a space to form (0) relationships. As our chat messages have become shorter and are sent at speed, the (20) \_\_\_\_\_ for misunderstanding has increased. Previously, some people used to show their academic (21) \_\_\_\_\_ by following the norms of punctuation. 0. A People’s birthdays are always special, but at Occidental College they are especially important. Each year on their birthday, students of the Occidental are tossed into the fountain on campus. The action is so unexpected that even the most prepared student is taken by surprise. You can be taken out of bed or class, and then processed across the campus to be pushed into the rather chilly water.

26. Once every year, as a chill hits the air, Swarthmore's campus transforms into a mystical land of fanciful beings, prehistoric beasts, and dragons. ### A Revolution in Recycling

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There is one man-made material that is prevalent in our ecosystem, whether (0) underground, in the air, or in the deepest ocean trenches. This substance is plastic, and its (30) \_\_\_\_\_ is what makes it so useful. Many products (31) \_\_\_\_\_ on this property; as one of the greatest achievements of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, it's hard to imagine what the modern world would look like without plastic cables stretching across ocean floors, water pipes, and packaging that keeps food fresh.

The downside is that much of the plastic that could be recycled ends up in landfill and takes between 400 and 1 000 years to (32) \_\_\_\_\_ depending on its type. ### The Anatomy of Spacesuits

Humans have explored the infinite abyss beyond Earth’s atmosphere for over half a century. (0) \_\_\_ A spacesuit is more like a miniature spacecraft you wear around your body than an item of clothing: it’s pressurised, designed to protect astronauts from fire and decked out with life support systems. (36) \_\_\_ No one has ever died because of a faulty spacesuit, but that doesn’t mean current models are perfect. Whether it’s for launch into space, re-entry back to Earth, or a spacewalk, astronauts have never been completely satisfied with the gear they are forced to put on for missions. (37) \_\_\_ Hollywood movies have glamorized the iconic suit and its design, leading the masses to believe it’s an outfit that can be slipped on within minutes. In fact, the spacesuit is its own fully functioning spacecraft that takes hours to put on and requires help from one’s colleagues.

Fortunately, though, thanks to huge investments by entrepreneurs like Elon Musk, we’re seeing more innovation in spacesuit design and performance than ever before. (38) \_\_\_ So astronauts going to the International Space Station (ISS) on private vehicles, such as SpaceX’s Crew Dragon, now wear spacesuits that are comfortable and easy to get on and off, as well as being extremely sleek and chic. This is no surprise, as they have been designed by legendary Hollywood costume designer Jose Fernandez, who is known for costumes in blockbusters, such as ‘Wonder Woman’, ‘Batman vs. Superman’, etc.

The most interesting work, however, has to do with NASA's next-generation spacesuit for astronauts on future missions to the Moon – the eXploration Extravehicular Mobility Unit, or xEMU. It is ostensibly the successor to the spacesuits worn by Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin. (39) \_\_\_\_\_ NASA scientists have incorporated what they have learned from the spacesuits used in orbit during the space shuttle and ISS eras of human exploration, as well as the hard lessons from the Apollo missions. The goal behind the Artemis long-term mission is to have people living and working on the Moon by 2025. (40) \_\_\_\_\_ “We are so excited about putting people back on the Moon,” says Richard Rhodes, a spacesuit engineer at NASA who’s working on the xEMU. “Our main goal is that the crew don’t even think about us. They put the suit on, and they do their work – the science, the exploration – and do not even think twice about how mobile they are or how effectively they can work. (41) \_\_\_\_\_ We’re making good progress.”

NASA spacesuits will soon benefit racing car drivers. In the competitive world of auto racing, a fraction of a second can mean the difference between winning or losing the cup. Many race teams shave their lap times down through engineering, such as better aerodynamics or reducing the weight of the car, but comfort tends not to be a priority. If there is one thing NASA astronauts and racing car drivers have in common, it is their bodies being subjected to different extreme conditions, something which would be potentially hazardous. (42) \_\_\_\_\_ They will bring recognition to their teams and sponsors.

### Money Smart

Having basic personal financial skills is one of the most important things you can do to live a healthy, happy and secure life. Your level of understanding the fundamentals of budgeting, saving, debts and investing can mean the difference between prosperity or being poor. It's a skillset many of us have, but perhaps lack the tools that help us actually execute it appropriately. The earlier you start, the better off you will be.

Financial literacy is the foundation of your relationship with money, and it is a lifelong journey of learning. Young people are growing up in a world where they are required to be financially literate in order to perform common tasks, such as using a debit card or choosing a mobile phone plan. And, as students become increasingly independent from their families, it is likely that the number and complexity of such tasks will rise in the short term.

As the financial landscape keeps developing, children and young people need a wide range of skills and knowledge to be able to successfully make informed choices about money that will serve them well as adults. Lack of financial literacy can have a devastating outcome on the score assigned to adults' consumer creditworthiness, which impacts the ability to purchase or rent a home. Therefore, it is crucial for schools to provide students with financial literacy skills that are applied daily. Practical lessons about money include building a simple budget, comparison shopping, or warning about falling into the trap of attractive discounts and other irrational spending decisions, as well as about understanding the value and cost of things and the difference between needs versus wants, etc. Research has shown that financial education improves financial confidence and increases positive changes in

financial behaviour such as saving and investing money. This is important for overall financial freedom and wellbeing – feeling in control of your finances and having the flexibility to make choices that allow you to enjoy life.

However, various surveys and tests show that young adults are amongst the lowest levels of financial literacy. This is reflected by their general inability to choose the right financial products and often a lack of interest in undertaking sound financial planning. In order to combat financial ignorance or to strengthen financial skills, many countries have mandated some form of financial literacy education, which, unfortunately, hasn't always been very successful.

The OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment included an optional assessment that examines 15-year-old students' understanding about money matters and financial literacy. Around 117 000 students took part in this assessment, representing about 13.5 million students from 20 participating countries and economies.

According to the OECD, these assessments are important not only for ascertaining what students have learned about financial literacy, but also for checking the students' application of their knowledge in unfamiliar settings, both inside and outside school. The problem becomes worse when they finish school. For many young people, college or university is their first money management experience. However, many students are not adequately prepared to handle their own finances and have acquired a reputation of irresponsibility and impulsivity, which has contributed to the perception that they are poor managers of money.

Building up students' financial literacy is critical not only to their understanding of personal finances, but also to their role in the local and global economy as consumers, employees and employers in their adulthood. Teachers and parents have an important role in equipping students with the knowledge and skills to make healthy and informed financial decisions. Setting simple, age-appropriate tasks that focus on the value of money, the importance of budgeting and saving, and evaluating the consequences of financial decisions, sets the foundation for students to become financially confident adults.
