- *Would you agree that age difference is important in choosing friends? Why?*

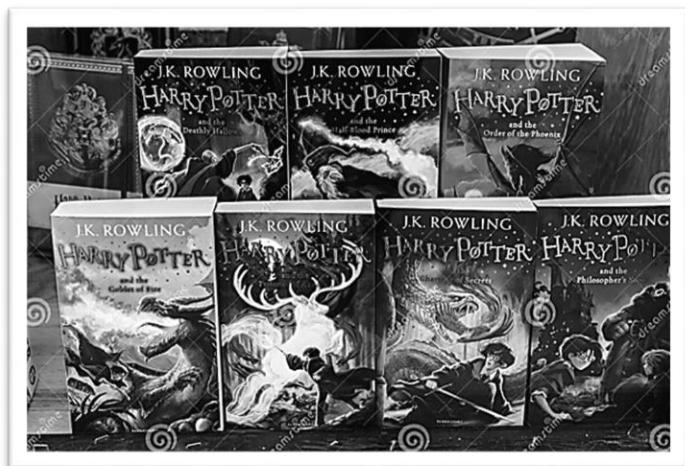
