

## RESULTS EVALUATION

### *Basic-I category (A1–A2 level) state language proficiency exam*

#### **Reading and writing part**

- If, when completing the reading and writing part tasks, the candidate scores 13 points or more in the A1 level reading and writing tasks (correctly completes at least 60% of the A1 level points (tasks 1–4, 22 points)), it is concluded that he/she can read and write in Lithuanian at A1 level.
- If the candidate scores 17 points or more (correctly completes at least 60% of the A2 level points (tasks 5–9, 28 points)), their level of proficiency in reading and writing in Lithuanian is A2.
- A prerequisite for achieving A2 level is achieving A1 level in the reading and writing part.

#### **Listening part**

- If, when completing the listening part tasks, the candidate scores 6 points or more in the A1 level listening tasks (correctly completes at least 60% of the A1 level points (tasks 1–2, 10 points)), it is concluded that he/she reads and writes Lithuanian at the A1 level.
- If the candidate scores 6 points or more (correctly completes at least 60% of the A2 level points (tasks 3–4, 10 points)), their level of proficiency in reading and writing in Lithuanian is A2.
- A prerequisite for achieving A2 level is achieving A1 level in the listening part.

#### **Speaking part**

- The speaking part consists of 3 speaking situations (tasks). The assessing examiner can award 0–3 points for each speaking situation. The interviewing examiner can award 0–1 points for the entire speaking part. The maximum number of points a candidate can score is 10.
- If the candidate scores 5 points or more (from the assessing examiner and the interviewing examiner) and receives at least 2 points in two speaking situations, the A1 speaking level is determined.
- If the candidate scores 6 points or more (from the assessing examiner and the interviewing examiner) and receives 5 points in at least two speaking situations, the A2 speaking level is determined.

**ATTENTION!** Obtaining 5 points does not guarantee that you have achieved level A1, and obtaining 6 points does not guarantee that you have achieved level A2. See the examples provided.

<b>Interviewing examiner (0–1) – 1 point.</b>
<b>Assessing examiner:</b>
<b>Task 1 (0–3) – 2 points,</b>
<b>Task 2 (0–3) – 2 points,</b>
<b>Task 3 (0–3) – 0 points.</b>
<b>Total: 5 points, A1 level achieved.</b>

**No. 3**

<b>Interviewing examiner (0–1) – 1 point.</b>
<b>Assessing examiner:</b>
<b>Task 1 (0–3) – 2 points,</b>
<b>Task 2 (0–3) – 2 points,</b>
<b>Task 3 (0–3) – 1 points.</b>
<b>Total: 6 points, A1 level achieved.</b>

**No. 4**

<b>Interviewing examiner (0–1) – 1 point.</b>
<b>Assessing examiner:</b>
<b>Task 1 (0–3) – 3 points,</b>
<b>Task 2 (0–3) – 2 points,</b>
<b>Task 3 (0–3) – 0 point.</b>
<b>Total: 6 points, A2 level achieved.</b>

**Final exam result**

*Basic-I category state language proficiency exam*

- When A2 level is achieved in all three parts of the exam, the final exam result is "A2 level".
- If at least one part is passed at A1 level, the final exam result is "A1 level".
- If at least one part of the exam is failed, the final exam result is "Failed."

ATTENTION! Persons who have passed the state language exam for obtaining a permanent residence permit in Lithuania will not be issued a basic (A1 level) state language proficiency certificate if they have achieved A1 level in the exam.
