Topic: **Independence & Support**

Task: Read the statement and answer the questions below.

 - How might avoiding support influence the way young people build and maintain relationships?

Topic: **Loyalty & Conflict**

Task: Read the statement and answer the questions below.

Loyalty is often described as the “glue” that holds people and their relationships together.

- What is your reaction to the content of the statement? Justify your answer by explaining why.
 - Why do people sometimes remain loyal to a person who behaves inappropriately, and what impact might it have on relationships?
 - How can situations of conflict affect relationships, and when might it strengthen loyalty?
- ❖ *Additional question: Should loyalty have limits, or should it remain constant in all situations? Why?*

2. DIALOGUE

Time: 4–5 minutes

Topic: **Media: Entertainment or Hidden Influence?**

Situation: Together with your partner, you are taking part in a creative lab for young content creators. You are working to prepare an educational podcast that addresses the topic above and why it is relevant to your generation. The podcast should last ten minutes and offer practical and convincing advice.

Task: In your discussion, exchange the following information:

- consider why the topic matters,
- explore **both** perspectives on the topic,
- agree on at least one piece of advice young people could follow, and justify why this advice would be helpful.
