Task: Read the statement and answer the questions below.

People can have many different kinds of friendships, and not all of them serve the same purpose.

- What is your reaction to the content of the statement? Justify your answer by explaining why.
 - Why are people often drawn to friendships that feel comfortable and predictable, and how might these friendships influence personal growth?
 - How can relationships influence the choices young people make about their future, and why can this influence sometimes be helpful?
- ❖ *Additional question: Can supportive friendships sometimes be more problematic than challenging ones? Why or why not?*
